WHO

Teams consist of 8-12 co-ed players of all ages. Teams must include at least 4 females. Players younger than 7 are encouraged to be cheerleaders/mascots for the favorite team.

REGISTRATION

Register your team online at diocesehelena.org/kickball (Pre-registration by SEPT. 21 IS STRONGLY encouraged!) On-site registration allowed, but may delay your start time. \$10 per person. Lunch is provided.

WHY SHOULD MY CHURCH

PLAY KICKBALL?

The Catholic Youth Coalition in the Diocese of Helena sponsors this tournament because sometimes we just need to get outside and celebrate being together. Kickball does exactly that by building fellowship through a childhood game that caters to the non-athletic. This is a great event for families and youth of all ages.

The entire purpose of this event is to have fun, creating memories and friendships that will last. A healthy level of competitiveness is encouraged, but it should remain respectful and not otherwise distracting from the family-friendly, joyful environment.

Each team must have a Team Captain, who should be an adult. The Team Captain will serve as the primary contact and be responsible for gathering registrations and fees.

Families are strongly encouraged to play together. All ages and faiths are welcome. To compete on the field a person should be at least 7-years old. Team captains may, however, negotiate prior to each game to permit younger players. Regardless, children under 7 may attend at nocost and must be accompanied by a parent/guardian.

Pre-registration by September 21 is strongly encouraged! We will accept on-site registration, but it slows down the entire tournament.

A little note on the schedule: We want to encourage people to worship in their home church before the tournament, but we don't want the tournament to end at midnight either. So, check-in will open at 11:30am, and we will begin the first games at 12noon or as soon as we have enough teams checked-in. If teams arrive early, then we'll start early and will add teams to the tournament as they arrive and fields become available.



Youth Ministers & Adult Chaperones

Thank you for accompanying young people - literally and figuratively during their adolescence, helping to form them in virtue and faith. Events like kickball provide you the chance to engage young people from your community in a fun environment and establish trust that can develop throughout your ministry program and activities.

We take seriously our responsibility for maintaining a safe environment at all events, including caring for both the physical and mental well-being of children. We expect all adults to model appropriate behavior and enforce such behavior among the minors for whom they are responsible, including: no profane language; no use of any alcohol, tobacco/e-cigs, or drugs during the event; and wearing modest clothing that does not promote ideas contrary to our Christian values.

Unless accompanied by a parent/guardian, minors (under 18) must be accompanied by an Adult Chaperone (21+). All participants must agree to abide by our Code of Conduct and are expected to abide by the safe environment and/or other chaperoning policies of their respective church/group. Adults who are chaperoning youth from a Diocese of Helena parish/school must be compliant with Diocese of Helena Safe Environment Policy (VIRTUS).

Chaperones and minors do not have to be on the same team, but the chaperone must be present for the duration of the tournament or until the youth leaves. The parent/chaperone is responsible for the safety and well being of their youth at all times, including knowing their whereabouts and communicating with parent(s)/guardian(s) in the case of emergency.

HIGHLIGHTS:

- All minors (under 18) must be accompanied by either a parent/guardian or an Adult Chaperone (11:1 Youth-to-Chaperone Ratio).
- Only those who are 21+ may serve as an Adult Chaperone.
- Adult Chaperones from Diocese of Helena parishes/schools must be VIRTUS-certified in accord with Diocese of Helena Safe Environment policy.
- Adult Chaperones not from a Diocese of Helena school/parish are not obligated to be ✓ VIRTUS-certified but must agree to our Code of Conduct and are expected to follow the safe environment/chaperone policies of their respective church/group.
- Young adults (18-20) are encouraged to participate in the event! However, you may not serve as an Adult Chaperone for minors.
- Minors (under 18) should not drive themselves or others to/from the event.
- Tobacco & Drug Free: No participant may use or be under the influence of any drug or alcohol, including "e-cigs."
- Dress Code: Team uniforms/theme clothing are encouraged! And, all clothing should be modest, appropriate for sport activity, and may not promote drugs/alcohol or ideas contrary to our Christian values.

The Official Rules All participants should read through the rules.

1. The Playing Field

1.00 Head Umpire will designate a field suitable for play in accordance with the following provisions which equal the dimensions of a softball field. The kickball 4.02 Each team shall have one Captain diamond is a square with equal sides of 60 feet or 20 paces: The distance from home plate to second base, and from first and fees; all team players not on the base to third base is 84 feet 10 1/4 inches or 28 paces respectively; The pitching strip is in the center of the diamond, 42 feet 5 1/8 inches or 14 paces from home plate, and directly aligned with the first base/third base diagonal.

- 1.01 The strike zone extends to 1 foot on assist in retrieving foul balls and may either side of home plate, and 1 foot high. switch with other team members to
- 1.02 All participants must respect and obey all rules and regulations pertaining to the respective field used for play during the game.

2. Equipment

- 2.00 Athletic shoes are required. Metal cleats are not allowed.
- 2.01 Players may wear protective equipment providing it does not offer the wearer an unfair performance advantage.
- 2.02 The official kickball will be a 10-inch play ground ball. This will be provided by 8.00 Pitch speed - no missiles. Must be OYYĂM.

3. Officials

3.00 Games must be officiated by at least one participant: a Head Umpire. The Head Umpire governs all game play has final say over rule interpretation, and issues all final rulings. Other referees may assist these officials when available.

- 3.01 The Head Umpire must read the following Game Opener 5 minutes before the game starts: "I am the Head Umpire and will issue all final rulings if necessary. The only participants who may dispute a call are the team's designated Captain and Co-Captain."
- 3.02 Umpires have jurisdiction over play and may: Call a time out; Make a decision 9.00 All kicks must be made by foot and regarding players under 7 if team captains occur at or behind home plate. Bunting is cannot agree as described in 4.00; Penalize a player, including game ejection, for unsportsmanlike conduct (éjected participants may not return to the game)
- 3.03 An umpire will keep official time for each game.

4. Teams

4.00 Each team must consist of a minimum of 8 and no more than 12 players. All players should be 7 years old. Team captains may negotiate at the beginning of the game to permit younger persons to play.

- 4.01 Teams must field at least 8 players 10.01 Neither leading off base, nor minimum of 4 players of each sex.

5. Base Coaches

5.00 Two members of the team at kick must coach first and third base. They will remain in the proper kicking lineup.

7. Regulation Games

7.00 Regulation games last 4 full innings or 30 minutes.

- 7.01 In the event of a tie score at the end of the game, extra full innings shall commence until a winner is determined.
- 7.02 A team Captain may raise protest with the umpire for blatant rule infraction. but will accept the umpire's final ruling.

8. Pitching/Catching

- a slow to medium speed pitch.
- 8.01 No "bouncies." A pitch that is higherlanding in bounds, but traveling out of than 1-foot at the plate, must be rethrown.
- 8.02 The pitcher must stay behind the pitching strip until the ball is kicked.
- 8.03 No player other than the catcher may field in front of the pitcher or advance completes the team's half of the inning. beyond the 1st -3rd base diagonal until the ball is kicked.
- 8.04 The catcher must field directly behind the kicker and may not cross home plate before the ball is kicked.

9. Kicking

not allowed.

10. Running

10.00 Runners must stay within the base line. Fielders must stay out of the base line. Fielders trying to make an out on base may have their foot on base, but must lean out of the baseline. Runners hindered by any fielder within the base line shall be safe at the base to which they were running.

- and no more than 12. Teams must field a stealing a base is allowed. A runner off of his/her base when the ball is kicked is out.
 - 10.02 Hitting a runner with the ball above shoulder level is not allowed. Any runner hit above the shoulders is safe and advances one base. If the runner intentionally uses the head to block the ball, and is so called by the umpire, the runner is out.
 - 10.03 After a kicked ball is caught, runners must tag their originating base before running to the next base. All ties will go to the runner. Runners may overrun first base.
 - 10.04 One base on an overthrow into fair territory. In taking advantage of the time loss from an overthrown ball that travels out of bounds, a runner may not run beyond the subsequent base to the one originally running toward when the ball was thrown.

11. Strikes & Balls

11.00 There are no strikes or balls. Every player kicks.

12. Fouls

12.00 A count of four constitutes an out.

12.01 A foul is:

A kick landing out of bounds; A kick bounds on its own before reaching first or third base (any ball touched by an inbounds fielder is automatically in play); or, a kick made in front of home plate.

13. **Outs**

13.00 A count of three outs by a team

13.01 An out is:

A runner touched by the ball at any time while not on base;

Any kicked ball (fair or foul) that is caught; A ball tag on a base to which a runner is forced to run; Or, a runner off of his/her base when the ball is kicked.

14. Ball in Play

14.00 Once the pitcher has the ball in control and on the mound, the play ends.

14.01 If a runner intentionally touches or stops the ball, the play ends.



This roster will be used to keep track of tournament bracket and can be filled out at check-in. A team consists of 8-12 players, ages 7+, with at least 4 of each sex. Every participant needs to submit the Registration & Medical Release Form (preferably at diocesehelena.org/kickball).

Individuals are discouraged from registering. In the case that you do not have a full team or have extra players, you may register individuals as "Free Agents," and they will be assigned a team on the day of the tournament.
